

# UNI-PH Building – What to Do in an Emergency

## FIRE



### ALERT

- Stay calm!
- Call the fire service, tel: (0) **118** or activate the fire alarm



### RESCUE AND WARN

- Provide assistance
- Alert those in danger
- Rescue the handicapped and injured



### EXTINGUISH

- Fight the fire with a fire blanket, hand-held fire extinguisher and/or hydrant hose
- Do not place yourself in danger!



### CLOSE

- Close windows and doors as you leave (prevent smoke and fire from spreading)



### CAUTION!

- **Never** use the lifts in the event of a fire!

## EVACUATION



### LISTEN AND OBEY

- Obey instructions from the alarm organisation (telephone, loudspeaker), the emergency team and information sheets



### EVACUATE

- Leave the building quickly and quietly
- Follow emergency exit signs
- **Never** use the lifts if there is a fire!



### OTHER PEOPLE

- Rescue the handicapped and injured
- Do not place yourself in danger!



### GATHER

- Make your way immediately to the meeting point
- Do not leave the meeting point until instructed to do so



### CAUTION!

- **Never** return to the danger area!

## FIRST AID



### PRINCIPLE

1. Look (review the situation)
2. Think (be careful of consequent risks)
3. Act (protect yourself, secure the accident site)



### ALERT

- Stay calm!
- Ambulance, tel: (0) **144**
- **Internal medical service (041) 229 50 50**



### RESCUE FROM DANGER

- Remove the injured from danger zones (careful with back injuries)
- Stay calm, work cautiously
- Do not place yourself in danger!



### EMERGENCY MEASURES

- Protect yourself!
- Assess general condition using ABC
- First aid measures



### ATTEND

- Attend to the injured until the rescue team arrives
- Help the rescue team
